

Replacing 194 windows would not be an easy task, and the cost of \$212,000 for new, double-paned, vinyl-clad windows was particularly daunting. For the Little Sisters of the Poor, however, everything is possible with trust in St. Joseph's Divine Providence. Just when needed, a generous legacy came to the Home at the first of the year. It covered the complete cost of the windows with a little more to spare.


