

Entertaining staff and Residents on a blistery cold, Russianlike-weather afternoon. Nekrasova, new seamstress for the Little Sisters, introduced us to her native Russian culture. Sharing her artistic and musical talents, Irina presented a vibrant display of her creative work: Russian hats, dresses, beaded vests, dolls dressed in beautiful costumes, and a traditional Russian salad enjoyed by the Residents at their noon meal. As she presented her creations, she provided an informative commentary on Russian history and the significance of each to her motherland.

A real highlight of her presentation was her sharing her wonderful gift as a concert pianist. Irina began playing the piano in Russia when she was 7 years old. After graduating from music school when she was 15, she attended the College of Arts in Rostov-on-Don. Russia where she studied piano and chamber music, and trained to teach piano. After graduating from college, Irina joined the Rachmaninoff Conservatory where continued her study of the piano for five more years. A lively round of traditional Russian gypsy music capped her beautiful Russian compositions.

When not sewing for the Little Sisters and Residents, Irina does costuming for the Denver Opera during its season. Thank you, Irina, for sharing your Russian traditions with us!

A letter written to Bishop Matz in Denver. December 30, 1911. The Mullen Home opened in March of 1918.

"I am pleased to tell you that the plans for the Home in Oakland, of which I spoke to you have been approved by the General Council, and they say that they can also serve Denver. The architect is now making larger ones, and they will be ready in about two months. With pleasure at the occasion, Monsignor, I wish you a most Happy New Year, also the Rev. Father Phillip, your dear Sister and also the Mullens and family. Recommending myself to your pious prayers. I remain in Jesus & Mary.
